## **How to Biblically Appeal to Our Authorities**

How we see ourselves. What is our goal in our life will make a difference in how we appeal to our authorities.
When we have a biblical approach to appealing to our authorities as a servant of Jesus we glorify our Lord.
God knows who we are, where we are, and what is best for us.
God found Saul

- 1 Samuel 10:21-22 (ESV)
- <sup>21</sup> He brought the tribe of Benjamin nearby its clans, and the clan of the Matrites was taken by lot;<sup>[a]</sup> and Saul the son of Kish was taken by lot. But when they sought him, he could not be found. <sup>22</sup> So they inquired again of the LORD, "Is there a man still to come?" and the LORD said, "Behold, **he has hidden himself among the baggage**."

God found Gideon

Judges 6:11-12 (ESV)

<sup>11</sup> Now the angel of the LORD came and sat under the terebinth at Ophrah, which belonged to Joash the Abiezrite, while his son **Gideon was beating out wheat in the winepress to hide it from the Midianites**. <sup>12</sup> And the angel of

the LORD appeared to him and said to him, "The LORD is with you, **O mighty man of valor."** 

God found his disciples

Matthew 4:18-19 (ESV)

<sup>18</sup> While walking by the Sea of Galilee, **he saw two brothers**, Simon (who is called Peter) and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. <sup>19</sup> And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." [a]

## God found Zacchaeus

Luke 19:4-5 (ESV)

<sup>4</sup> So he ran on ahead and **climbed up into a sycamore tree** to see him, for he was about to pass that way. <sup>5</sup> And when **Jesus came to the place**, **he looked up** and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down, for I must stay at your house today."

## **God found Gary Payne**

Psalm 75:6-7 (ESV)

- <sup>6</sup> For not from the east or from the west and not from the wilderness comes lifting up,
- <sup>7</sup> but it is God who executes judgment,

putting down one and lifting up another.

6 Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time he may exalt you,
Matthew 25:21 (ESV)  21 His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. [a] You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.
We can make our appeals in the <b>flesh</b> or in the <b>Spirit</b> .
Six Basic Requirements for an Effective Appeal

Nehemiah 1:6-8 (ESV)

1. Must be in right standing.

<sup>6</sup> let your ear be attentive and your eyes open, to hear the prayer of your servant that I now pray before you day and night for the people of Israel your servants, **confessing the sins of the people of Israel**, which we have sinned against you. **Even I and my father's house have sinned**. <sup>7</sup> We have acted very corruptly against you and have not kept the commandments, the statutes, and the rules that you commanded your servant Moses.

2. Must have the <b>Right Motives</b>
Why are we making the appeal to our authority?
Why are we making the appeal to our authority?
<ul> <li>Be concerned for your authorities' <u>reputation</u></li> <li>Be concerned for your authorities' <u>goals</u>.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Be concerned for your authorities' <u>authority</u>.</li> </ul>
3. We must appeal at the appropriate time.
4. We must give accurate information to our authority.
5. We must have the right attitudes.
How is <b>motive</b> different <b>attitude</b> ?
Motive is: Why we make our appeal.
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Attitude is: How we make our appeal.

Philippians 2:4-5 (ESV)

<sup>4</sup> Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. <sup>5</sup> Have this **mind** among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, <sup>[a]</sup>

Attitudes not to have are Critical attitude or a Judgmental attitude.
Matthew 7:3 (ESV)  3 Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye?
Many times people cannot see our <b>hearts</b> because of our <b>attitude</b> .
Three good attitudes to have when we make our appeals:  1) Reverence 2) Loyalty
3) Gratefulness
6. We must use appropriate words.
Our words need to be:
1) Gracious
2) Humble
3) Truthful

Colossians 4:6 (ESV)

<sup>6</sup> Let your speech always be **gracious**, **seasoned with salt**, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person.

Colossians 4:6 (MSG)

<sup>6</sup> Be **gracious** in your speech. The goal is to bring out the **best in others** in a conversation, **not put them down, not cut them out**.

Concluding Remarks about making an appeal are:

- Make appeals **sparingly**, they are more likely to be received.
- We are not to **manipulate** our delegated authority.
- We are to pray, encourage, support, and trust God to bless, convict, remove, or change our delegated authority.
- After making an appeal, we need to be ready to present a **solution** if asked.
- Many of us are fearful of making an appeal to our authorities and would rather have a **bitter spirit** or try to undermine their authority.
- Most of the time there is more going on than just the appeal, do lose sight of the **big picture**.
